SPECIAL NOTE ABOUT CHILDREN.

We do not offer the Service to, or knowingly collect or solicit information through the Service from or about, anyone under the age of eighteen (18). Accordingly, if you are under the age of eighteen (18), do not use the Service or provide any information about yourself to us.

INFORMATION WE COLLECT.

<u>Personal Information</u> – We limit the amount of information we collect from users of the Service. When users enter your personal information into our dark web search service, the information is hashed (encrypted) directly on the user's device, and only a small portion of that hash is sent to our servers. Our servers return a broad set of potential matches, and the user's device privately checks this set against the complete hash. As a result, user-identifying personal information entered into the search service is not sent to or stored by our servers.

We may offer newsletters that require users to provide an email address for delivery of the newsletters. Additionally, in connection with your use of our Services, we may collect unique identifiers, such as an Internet Protocol (IP) address, a processor or device serial number or other unique device identifiers, that are combined with other information that might permit identification of users connected to that device. Users may be able to limit the device information they share with us and other parties through the privacy settings on such devices. The foregoing categories of information in this paragraph are referred to herein as "Personal Information." Our legal basis for the processing of Personal Information is our legitimate interests in providing the Services, performing a contract with user and for the purposes of analysis and improvement of our Services. In the course of providing our Services, we may also identify and collect information about users from third party sources that publish information about those users.

General Information

In addition to collecting Personal Information about you, whenever you interact with the Service, we and/or service providers may use a variety of technologies that automatically or passively collect information about how you access and use the Service that does not identify you personally ("General Information"). This includes your browser or device type, your operating system, the page served, the time, the preceding page views, and your use of features or applications on the Service. <u>Device Identifiers</u>. We may also automatically collect your IP address or other unique identifier ("Device Identifier") for the computer, mobile device, technology or other device you use to access the Service. A Device Identifier is a number that is automatically assigned to your device when you access a web site or its servers, and our computers identify your device by its Device Identifier.

HOW WE USE THE INFORMATION WE COLLECT.

The information collected by DataBreach.com may be used for a variety of business purposes, including:
